It's not about making art or being an artist or a writer or anyone else you presume is more creative than you are. And it doesn't mean you have to be "SERIOUS" to be creative! Being playful, simple and sometimes silly is a good thing when it comes to looking for creative ways to be present in your life. Lighten up!
